All the sleepers were notched and bored to a template beforehand; a carpenter and coolie conld do 50 per diem. Two, and sometimes three, inspectors (including Mr. Campion) were simultaneously renewing the line on different sections of the division. Their methods differed considerably; but each was allowed to pursue his own, subject to no other interference than an occasional suggestion, and the results were in each case most satisfactory.
